"image of God", "image of the Holy Spirit", often appearing in Latin as <i>Imago Dei</i>) is a theological doctrine which asserts that human beings are created in God's image and therefore have inherent value independent of their utility or function. (Wikipedia) How has the idea of Imago Dei, the fact that you are made in the image of God, changed the way you look at yourself and humankind in general?
7. In what ways do you think Jesus "images" God in His humanity?
